New Region Is Opened For Settlement In Palestine

The Great Development in the Vale of Zebulun

By DR. A. GRANOWSKY

EDITOR'S NOTE: A new region consisting of an industrial zone, near Haila, an urban development and an agricultural zone, is new being opened up for settlement for refugees from Germany and pioneers from other lands, who arrive in increasing numbers into Palestine. This great development is taking place in the great land area, known in biblical history as the Vale of Zebulun, which is the property of the Jewish National Fund. The author of this article, the land expert of the Keren Kayemeth, gives a vivid description of the highly important work now going on there.

The fact is that private concerns did hold lands, but they failed to meet their financial obligations and there was imminent danger that their lands would pass out of Jewish possession for ever. It was for this among other reasons that the Jewish National Fund, supported by the Palestine Economic Corporation (New York), stepped in and acquired an additional tract comprising 26,000 dunams. This purchase, too, drew bitter criticism, namely that by nationalizing the lands instead of leaving them within the sphere of influence of private initiative, the Jewish National Fund created an obstacle to the development of economic forces.

A Large Jewish Settlement

The only guarantee for the desirable development of Haifa (as well as our settlement work here in general), lies in the establishment of a large and united Jewish settlement on a simple and pre-conceived plan. The Emek Zebulun lands -less the sand-dunes-40,000 dunams, of which comprise an area for a larger city; (it comprises approximately 27,000 dunams belong to the Jewish National Fund, 5,000 to the Palestine Economic Corporation, 8,000 dunams to the Haifa Bay Development Company and its clients, and several pieces to private persons). This area is large enough to absorb numerous industrial enterprises and thousands of dwellings, with farms on the outskirts of the city. The fact that 67.5 per cent of the land is owned by the Jewish National Fund makes it possible to carry out a systematic development scheme, instead of allowing confusion to reign as in other cities, and not to a small measure in Tel Aviv.
